Concert by Pianist Dan Kennedy

Amherst, Massachusetts composer, recording artist Dan Kennedy will play a Contemporary Solo Piano concert at the Southwick Public Library on Wednesday, January 21st at 7 P.M.. Classically trained at the Oberlin and New England Conservatories, Dan will play an original coffeehouse-style set influenced by classical, jazz, and folk music. His music has been heard on over 200 radio station and he has worked with two Grammy winning producers. Dan's album INTUITION was produced by Grammy winner Corin Nelsen, peaked at #7 on the ZMR Top 100 Chart and was named a Top 10 Album of 2012 by John P. Olsen. This concert is free and open to the public.

Addendum to *Library Links*

The following are additions to the paper version of *Library Links* and are **not** part of the official document produced by the Library and is not produced using public funds or staff.

✓ **New Blog For Teens**

The Library staff have created a new **blog spot** for teens to share information on activities and events of interest to teens. This addition is a move from the Facebook page for young adults the library has had for several years. As a result the existing **Facebook** page is now for library users of all ages. Links to both are available at the top of this document.

✓ **New Computer Monitor Advertising Library Programs**

The library now features a monitor at the *Circulation Desk* featuring a listing of upcoming library programs and other library news. It is provided at no additional cost to the public. It is a repurposing of a surplus library computer. It currently advertises the *Lego Club* and other activities at the library.

✓ **Friends Spring Book Sale**

The **Friends of the Southwick Public Library** are planning for the Spring 2015 Book Sale. This is one of the major fundraising activities of the group which funds a number of programs, passes and other expenses for the Library. Details will be available in *Library Links* and on the Friends Facebook page. Stay tuned.

✓ **Young Adult Programs**

✓ **Library to Offer Programs Funded by the local Cultural Council**

During the January 13 monthly Trustees meeting it was announced that the Library has received notification of funding from the *Southwick Cultural Council* for three programs. The programs will be held over the next 6 -9 months. The Cultural Council is funded in part by the *Mass. Cultural*

Council a state agency. Additional information will be provided in Library Links and press release in area media outlets.

✓ **Online Access to The Republican and other newspapers**

Library users in the four counties of western Mass. now have online access to more than 10 regional newspapers for one year. The funding is courtesy of the *Mass. Library System*, *UMASS*, the *Springfield Public Library* and several other organizations. Pending funding this resource will be available in future years. The newspapers include *The Republican* and the *Berkshire Eagle*. Access is available using a library computer or for access from your computer at home or on the road contact the Reference Department staff at the library. The effort to make this happen was the result of efforts by volunteers with the *Western Mass. Library Advocates*. A link is available from the Library page on the town website. The *Boston Globe* and *New York Times* are also available courtesy of state funding.

✓ **State Certifies Southwick Library for 2015**

The **Mass. Board of Library Commissioners** (MBLC) at their November 2014 meeting recertified the Southwick Public Library for 2015. At the same time they approved the first half of state funding for the fiscal year at just over \$ 6,000 for the library. The Governor later in the month cut state spending which will cause a small increase in library funding for the year.

✓ **Town Funding of the Library**

All town departments including the Library have submitted their proposed budgets for next year (July 1, 2015 - June 30, 2016) to the *Board of Selectmen* and *Finance Committee*. Usually budget hearings are held in February with a proposed budget submitted to the public for approval at the *Annual Town Meeting* in May 2015. Dates for the hearings have not been announced. As this information becomes available it will be posted here and on the Southwick Library website. The public is encouraged to attend to support the Library and other departments in order to provide appropriate service to the public.

✓ **Non-town Funding for the Library**

Each year the Library applies for funds from area charities and foundations to support programs and materials for children, adults and senior citizens. Based on the amount of available funds and the number and amount of requests by others the Library is usually able to obtain small amounts in

this way. These organizations include Westfield based non-profits, the [Mass. Board of Library Commissioners \(MBLC\)](#)ⁱ a state agency, the [Friends of the Southwick Public Library, Inc.](#), [a local 501(c)(3) charitable organization], the [Southwick Cultural Council](#)ⁱⁱ and recently the Westfield Kiwanis. Several programs during the year were funded by the [Southwick Cultural Council](#).ⁱⁱ The library submitted several applications to the [Southwick Cultural Council](#) for programs in 2015. A number of programs annually are funded by the Friends. Please consider supporting these organizations in their respective fund raising activities. This includes book sales and other events and activities. Watch this space, **Library Links** or local media outlets for more information.

The funds from the MBLC are used in part to purchase computers, shelving and other capital items not funded by the Town of Southwick. In 2013 it also included replacement of the computer server in the Library as well as replacement of several computers. This Summer several computers will be replaced (as part of the normal rotation) using the state funds. It is subject to the annual appropriation by the State Legislature. The second half of the MBLC funding for FY 2015 is anticipated to be received during the May/June period.

Training and other resources for friends groups and library trustees are provided in part by the [Mass. Library Trustees Association \(MLTA\)](#), the [Mass. Friends of Libraries \(MFOL\)](#) and the [Western Mass. Library Advocates](#).

ⁱ Funded by the State Legislature through the State budget process. *Approximately* \$ 10,000 per year provided by the MBLC . In prior years this was as high as approximately \$ 15,000.

ⁱⁱ Funded **in part** by the State Legislature through the State budget process and **in part** by the Town of Southwick. (\$ 1,500 municipal appropriation)
